Firstly a big **thank you** to both our new and long-suffering supporters for your generosity that is making such a **huge** difference to children in Uganda.

We are the first to admit that our communication has been poor – please accept our apologies and our commitment to improve this by sending regular updates. We are very pleased to say that things have been going well in Uganda. With your help we have been enabling a lot of children to receive an education that they otherwise would not get.

Over **200** children have attended primary school through the LFL assisted places scheme



36 young people have attended Namugongo School which provides a combined curriculum enabling students to leave school with O and/or A levels and vocational skills in computer studies, tailoring, woodwork or construction.



13 young people have attended other secondary schools, leading to A levels

15 young people have been directly sponsored to learn a trade at a vocational college.

Over 80 vulnerable girls have been receiving part-time vocational training to enable them to earn a living for themselves.
